


Plympton's Current Program

- Very High amount of trash is being disposed of year, average 1330 lbs in central mass. per Household- 1926 lbs of trash by users per
- Current fee structure is not sustainable
- that disposes of 10 bags per week. 1 bag a week you pay the same as someone Current system is a flat fee so if you dispose of


What is SMART?

- Unit-based pricing (like a utility)
- Signals to residents the true costs of solid waste disposal
- recycle compost more Creates a financial incentive to use less and



How does it work?

- The fixed costs of operating the transfer station is paid for by an annual fee
- of transporting and disposing of trash SMART bags are priced to cover the cost



PAYI Benefits

- Reduction in waste disposal (and associated cost (depending on where you are starting from) savings) from 30% to as much as 50% reported
- Reductions may occur from a variety of reasons, including:
- More recycling and yard waste diversion
- More donation of items (furniture, etc.)
- Reductions in illegal use of current program
- Backyard composting
- Other forms of waste and materials diversion

Bag Distribution Is Easy!

- Bag vendors have taken over most of the work
- They warehouse the cases of bags
- They ship to retailers
- They track the sales
- They bill the retailers
- They provide the Town a monthly report and a CHECK!

SAVE Money And Reduce Trash
