

Plympton Planning Board meeting 5-15-17

Present were Deborah Anderson, William McClellan, and Paul D'Angelo. Absent were John Rantuccio and Dominique Sampson.

Meeting called to order by Chairman Deborah Anderson at 6:15 p.m.

The first order of business was to review minutes for the meetings of 3-13-17, 3-27-17 and 4-24-17. There were no additions or corrections noted. McClellan moved to accept the minutes as written. D'Angelo seconded. The vote was unanimously in favor.

The board voted to pay Express Newspapers \$240 for advertising three by-law warrant articles in the Plympton-Halifax Express. McClellan made the motion, D'Angelo seconded, and Anderson abstained because of her connection with the newspaper. Vote was in favor 2-0.

The board reviewed a report from Chessia Engineering, John Chessia, regarding the condition of the Blue Wave Lake Street solar array. Chessia's report told of ponding water throughout, washouts, and ineffective drainage. On a motion by d'Angelo, second by Anderson, the board voted to have Bill McClellan bring the report to Mark Flaherty, engineer for the project, to relay that the Plympton Planning Board is not happy with the results of the work and to ask him to submit a reply as to how and on what timetable the remedial work will be done. A copy of the report is attached with these minutes.

At 7 p.m. the board opened the continued hearing for the proposed marijuana moratorium article, which was continued from May 8 due to a meeting posting error. As was the case last week, there was no one in attendance for the hearing. Discussion among planning board members ensued, with the board in agreement that no action should be considered in reference to marijuana until the state legislature decides what it is going to do. The board closed the hearing at 7:17 p.m.

The meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m. The next meeting will be Monday, June 12, at 6 p.m.
