

### 1. Call to Order and Introductions

Chairperson Noreen O'Toole called the meeting to order at 12:00 P.M. and then read the Meeting Accessibility Statement and the Title VI Notice of Protection Statement. Those present then introduced themselves.

### 2. Public Comments

There were no public comments.

## 3. Minutes of the August 3, 2017 Meeting

Chairperson Noreen O'Toole asked if the members had reviewed the minutes of the August 3, 2017 Meeting. The members then unanimously endorsed the minutes of the August 3, 2017 Old Colony JTC Meeting.

#### 4. Communications

Shawn Bailey reviewed the contents of the communications staff report. Included were letters of correspondence, as well as notices of workshops and conferences.

### 5. Reports

## A. Brockton Area Regional Transit Authority (BAT)

Glenn Geiler stated that BAT has submitted a Competitive Bus Facilities grant application.

### B. Greater Attleboro-Taunton Regional Transit Authority (GATRA)

Paul Chenard stated that GATRA is looking for land in Plymouth to establish a bus maintenance facility.

GATRA is experiencing increased demand in the Pine Hills area.

GATRA's Ride Match program has launched. You can go online and select your location and your destination. The program will tell you the different options you have to get where you're going.

### C. South Coast Rail Project

Paul Chenard provided an update on the South Coast Rail Project. The most recent newsletter is in the staff report which highlights the upcoming preparation of the Draft Supplemental Environmental Document (DSEIR).

#### 6. Old Business

### A. FFY 2017-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Implementation

Charles Kilmer provided an update on projects with changes. They are as follows:

### **FFY 2017 Projects**

- <u>PLYMOUTH -- RECONSTRUCTION OF TAYLOR AVENUE, FROM WHITE HORSE ROAD TO MANOMET POINT ROAD, INCLUDES P-13-010 (605038)</u>
  - o Right of Way Certification Issued 08/14/2017

Tim Kochan stated that the PS&E for this project has gone to the MassDOT Federal Aid Program Office and it should be advertised shortly.

#### 7. New Business

### A. Route 53 Corridor Study (Hanover, Pembroke, Duxbury, and Kingston) – Existing Conditions

Ray Guarino provided a summary of the Route 53 Corridor Study. Ray Guarino then discussed the traffic volumes, travel speeds, and heavy vehicle traffic on Route 53, as well as pavement conditions.

Charles Kilmer stated that along Route 53 in Kingston, north of Tar Kiln Road there is a UPS distribution center. There is a meeting tomorrow with MassDOT, Kingston, OCPC, and design engineers to discuss potential improvements at the intersection of Route 53 at Route 3A.

### B. Statewide Bicycle Transportation Plan – Discussion and Opportunities to Provide Input

Paul Chenard discussed the Statewide Bicycle Transportation Plan. Through the Bicycle Transportation Plan update, the Commonwealth seeks to advance bicycling as a means of everyday transportation and as a form of recreation statewide. MassDOT is seeking public participation in the plan via an online survey and through an online mapping tool where individuals can indicate barriers that keep them from riding their bicycle. The Bicycle Transportation Plan update is being managed by Toole Design, an engineering, planning and landscape architecture firm. Currently Toole Design is in the data gathering phase.

Glenn Geiler asked if this is being launched at the Moving Together Conference. Paul Chenard stated that this plan has been launched for over a year. There will be a municipal resource guide on how communities can get information regarding this transportation plan at the Moving Together Conference.

## C. Old Colony Pavement Management System – Overview and Findings

Ray Guarino discussed the Old Colony Pavement Management System. The pavement management system involves windshield evaluation of road surfaces by staff in the field. This is done every four years to coincide with the Regional Transportation Plan update. The surveys document the severity and extent of specific surface deficiencies including: potholes and patching, alligator cracking, distortion, rutting, weathering/block cracking, transverse and longitudinal cracking, bleeding/polished aggregate, surface wear and raveling, corrugations, shoving, and slippage.

As a result of the data collection and analysis completed for the 2012 Old Colony RTP, the total cost to improve all federal aid eligible roads (bring all the roads up to the Excellent category) was estimated to be \$199,918,410. As a result of the data collection and analysis completed in 2016, the total cost to improve all federal aid eligible roads (bring all the roads up to the Excellent category) was estimated to be \$213,197,802.

Chairperson O'Toole asked if there is information for all the towns in our region. Ray Guarino replied yes, but only for federal aid roads.

## C. Regional Concerns and Local Community Transportation Issues

Rob May asked for an update on the South Station Expansion Project. Paul Chenard stated that it is in the environmental review phase and is now accepting comments.

Pat Ciaramella stated that the Implementing Best Practices Conference is taking place on September 18, 2017 at Holy Cross College in Worcester.

Don Howard asked why unclaimed money cannot be used for cities and towns. Chairperson O'Toole stated that the money is attached to a bank which cannot be used for cities and towns. Discussion followed.

Jimmy Pereira announced that MassDOT is starting a "Scan the Street for Wheels and Feet" Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Campaign.

Charles Kilmer stated that someone from Abington contacted OCPC asking what type of project was going on Route 18 south of Route 139. Tim Kochan stated that he will look into it.
