Recreational Marijuana (AICP)

In November 2016, Massachusetts voters approved Ballot Question 4, which legalized the use and possession of marijuana for non-medical ("recreational") purposes. The General Court subsequently made significant changes to the law, which became effective on July 28, 2017 when Governor Baker signed Chapter 55 of the Acts of 2017. This workshop will cover the changes in the law and the impacts on communities, local regulation or prohibition of marijuana establishments, optional local taxation, as well as changes to the regulation of medical marijuana. We will discuss how local communities can work within the framework of the law to properly plan for recreational marijuana. CM/ 1.5
